Key Points for Employees on Construction Jobsites

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Personal Responsibilities

- It is critical that individuals NOT report to work while they are experiencing illness symptoms.
- Individuals should seek medical attention if they develop these symptoms.

Social Distancing

- Do not host large group meetings. CDC recommends that we avoid gatherings of 10+ people
- To limit the number of people on a jobsite if at all possible. Stagger work times or contractors.

Jobsite/Office Practices

- Supervisors should ask employees if they have had any symptoms prior to entering the jobsites and require anyone who is sick or has any symptoms to go home and consult a physician.
- Instruct employees to clean their hands often.
- Provide soap and water and alcohol-based hand rubs in the workplace.
- Do not congregate in lunch areas.
- Do not share personal protection equipment (PPE).
- Ensure used PPE is disposed of properly.
- Provide routine environmental cleaning (doorknobs, keyboards, counters, and other surfaces).
- Do not use a common water cooler
- Request additional/increased sanitation (disinfecting) of portable toilets.
- Limit the amount of visitors/delivery personnel.

Managing Sick Employees

- Actively encourage sick employees to stay home.
- Employees should notify their supervisor and stay home if they are sick.
